#### Pharmacist:

The Pharmacist-Retail must have equivalent qualifications, competence and function in the same role as employed individuals performing the same or similar services at the facility.

## **Definition of Care or Service:**

The Pharmacist-Retail is legally responsible for all functions performed by supportive personnel (i.e., pharmacy techs, pharmacy students/inters/externs) and check all work specified by law. Scope of Service may include:

- Overseeing and checking employee and family members prescription fills
- Collaborating with inpatient providers on prescriptions that a patient can afford and will be compliant on once released from their inpatient stay
- Fill and verify prescriptions for patients who are being discharged from the facility to help with continuation of care
- Direct supervision of support personnel in the immediate assigned area.
- Delivers patient/family caregiver education
- Examines patient's medical history
- Demonstrates Clinical and Service excellence behaviors to include HCA Healthcare code of conduct core fundamentals in daily interactions with patients, families, co-workers and physicians

- Outpatient retail pharmacy.
- Patient care areas, all settings.
