<p>Flight Paramedic: The Flight Paramedic must have equivalent qualifications, competence and function in the same role as employed individuals performing the same or similar services at the facility.</p>
<p>Definition of Care or Service: The Flight Paramedic transports and transfers patients and assesses the extent of an illness or injury to establish and prioritize medical procedures to follow at facility. Scope of Service may include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clinical Excellence <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Provide clinical excellence in patient care during all phases of the transport from initial contact until care is relinquished to appropriate team members of the accepting medical facility. Delivery of this practice is accomplished by acquiring and maintaining a strong knowledge base in emergency and critical care practice. ○ Acquire and maintain extensive knowledge of policies, procedures, and protocols related to the Med-Trans critical care program. ○ Acquire and maintain the ability to stabilize and manage patients through all phases of transport from a field emergency response or an inter-hospital transport. • Transport Crew Member Involvement <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Acquire and maintain knowledge applicable to sections of the Federal Aviation Administration / Department of Transportation regulations. ○ Actively participate in Pre and Post Transport Briefings with all team members which may include communication specialists. ○ Proficient in use of transport vehicle radios and provide assistance to the pilot and fellow crew members as an active participant in the Crew Resource Management process. ○ Active participant in public education programs and public relations functions. ○ Maintains a culture of readiness, ensuring restocking of bags and transport vehicle, clean and operational equipment, timely shift checks and briefings, while always demonstrating a safe approach to all environments. • Initial and continuing education <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Active participant demonstrating competency in all training, which may include advanced skills and procedures approved by Medical Director, protocol testing, case reviews, initial training for new medical equipment and/or procedures, clinical rotations or clinical simulations, and lecture deliveries. ○ Maintains excellence in knowledge surrounding use of equipment and supplies associated with the program. ○ Provides assistance in professional growth of new employees serving as a clinical coach or preceptor. • Active participant in regular safety, education, quality, and outreach committee activity • Active participant in quality, educational and patient follow-up activities. • Assures proper use, maintenance and repair of medical equipment and medical supplies. • Demonstrates Clinical and Service excellence behaviors to include HCA Healthcare code of conduct core fundamentals in daily interactions with patients, families, co-workers and physicians

State Requirements: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maintains current paramedic licensure in state of practice
Experience: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 3 years recent experience in a critical care clinical setting • Minimum 3 years recent flight experience
Competencies: The Flight Paramedic will demonstrate: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Quality, Credentialing and Regulatory Readiness <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Completes all records and documents per Med-Trans policy which includes accurate documentation of the patient condition and care provided according to established standards and guidelines ○ Maintains licensure, certifications, immunizations, and educational requirements. ○ Actively participates in quality management programs and ensures constant state of regulatory readiness. • Flight Crew Member must meet the following requirements: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Must be able to withstand stress/demands of an active position. ○ Must be able to withstand many hours of: standing, sitting, walking, bending, & lifting. ○ Must be able to lift and move patients and equipment used. ○ Must be able to read, write, and speak English fluently. ○ Must have manual dexterity, good eye-hand coordination and adequate vision. ○ Must have no medical conditions that can be exacerbated by altitude changes. ○ Must be able to function effectively while exposed to environmental elements.

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- Must not be affected by motion sickness caused by aircraft operations.
- The Flight Environment can be challenging both physically and mentally. As such conditions which differ from the normal work office environment include but are not limited to:
 - Exposure to blood, bodily fluid and tissues.
 - Adhere to all OSHA Requirements
 - Exposure to operating aircraft, ground transport vehicles, loud noises, vibrations, & hot exhaust gases.
 - A small cabin area to deliver patient care with limited ability to maneuver.
 - Carrying transport equipment, lifting patients and stretchers.
 - Performing patient care for extended periods of time in potentially adverse conditions/situations.
 - Space constraints and a constantly moving environment.
 - Emergency exits are specific dimensions.
 - Aircraft are limited to certain weight & balance.
 - Exposure to hot/cold environments.
