Certified Surgical First Assistant

The Certified Surgical First Assistant must have equivalent qualifications, competence and function in the same role as employed individuals performing the same or similar services at the facility.

Definition of Care or Service:

The Certified Surgical First Assistant is a specifically trained individual who provides assisting services for the surgeon in both the preparation for and performance of surgery. Scope of Service may include:

- Maintains the sterile field
- Assists the surgeon by providing retraction and aiding exposure of the operative site.
- Anticipates the moves of the surgeon and assists in the safe and efficient completion of the surgical procedure
- Facilitates hemostasis of the surgical site by performing suction, irrigation and sponging the operative site during a surgical procedure
- Closing wound layers per surgeon's directive
- Clamping and tying cut tissue per surgeon's directive
- Harvest saphenous vein per surgeon's directive
- Dissect common femoral artery and bifurcate per surgeon's directive
- Securing drainage systems and selecting and applying dressings per surgeon's directive
- Demonstrates Clinical and Service excellence behaviors to include code of HCA Healthcare conduct core fundamentals in daily interactions with patients, families, co-workers and physicians

Setting(s):

• Surgical services areas including but not limited to hospitals and outpatient surgery centers

Supervision: Direct supervision by surgeon

• Indirect supervision by surgery department director, site manager or designee

Evaluator: Surgeon / supervising physician in conjunction with surgery department director or designee

Qualifications:

- High School diploma / GED or higher
- Proof of training with <u>one</u> of the below:
 - Graduation from a school of surgical technology and completion of a First Assistant Program (SA or ST International training program is acceptable)
 - Successful completion of a Surgical Assistant/Surgical Technology training program (SA or ST International training program is acceptable)
 - If a Surgical Assistant was certified BEFORE 12/1/2016 Surgical Assistant program is not required. (Grandfathered in due to OJT)
 - US military-trained in surgical assisting
- Certified as a Certified Surgical First Assistant (CSFA)

NOTE: Where education may not be defined in qualifications area of the Scope, HCA Healthcare requires the highest level of education completed (not training or courses) confirmed on your background check.

 - Two years of CSFA experience is preferred

Competencies:

The Certified Surgical First Assistant will demonstrate:

- Safe environment for patients
 - o Uses at least two ways to identify patients before treating or performing a procedure
 - Labels containers used for blood and specimens in the presence of the patient
 - Labels all medications and solutions on and off the sterile field in perioperative and procedural settings
 - Participates in the pre-procedure process to verify the correct procedure, for the correct patient, at the correct site / side and involves the patient in the verification process when possible.
- Participates in a time-out immediately before the start of an invasive procedure
- Surgical First Assistant Skills
 - Assist with positioning, prepping, draping of patient
 - Provide visualization of the operative field by the use of retraction, scissors, or electrocautery, as directed by the surgeon
 - Assists the surgeon in providing hemostasis by:
 - Applying electrocautery tip to clamp or tissue in a safe manner, as directed by surgeon
 - Sponging and utilizing pressure
 - Providing suction
 - Applying clamps on vessels and the tying or electrocoagulation of them, as directed by the surgeon
 - Placing hemoclips on vessels, as directed by the surgeon (in cardiac surgery only)
 - Provides closure of subcutaneous and skin layers
 - Performs suturing and stapling (external staples only)
 - Assists the surgeon at the completion of the procedure by:
 - Affixing and stabilizing drains
 - Cleansing the wound and applying the dressing
 - Assist with application of cast, splints, and other devices
 - o Inserts and removes urinary catheter
 - Harvests and prepares graft tissues (in cardiac surgery only)
- Infection Prevention
 - o Practices consistent hand hygiene
 - Uses personal protective equipment (PPE) when required
 - Required immunizations per Division requirements
 - o Complies with Isolation precautions
 - Maintains sterile field
