The DBS Neurophysiologist must have equivalent qualifications, competence and function in the same role as employed individuals performing the same or similar services at the facility, as defined by facility job description.

Definition of Care or Service:

Deep brain stimulation (DBS) is a therapy used to treat the symptoms of a number of medically refractory brain disorders including: Parkinson's disease, essential tremor, dystonia, neuropathic pain, and obsessive compulsive disorder. The success of this therapy depends upon the accurate placement of the DBS electrode into the targeted brain areas. Microelectrode recording (MER) and macrostimulation-mapping are commonly performed intraoperatively to ensure positive identification of DBS targets prior to implantation of the permanent DBS electrode. DBS neurophysiology differs from standard intra-operative neuromonitoring, in that it requires specialized equipment and highly experienced staff that can provide technical interpretation of the results directly to the neurosurgeon The Scope of Services includes:

- Assist with surgical planning
- Set-up, operate, and troubleshoot neurophysiology system
- Identify location of neurons responsive to kinesthetic, tactile, or visual stimulation
- Assist in the identification of stimulation-induced treatment efficacy and side effects
- Provide summary (technical interpretation) of MER and stimulation results to neurosurgeon, and assist in identification of optimal
- location to implant the DBS lead
- Upon request, consult on technical issues related to the DBS procedure
- Provide didactic support for OR staff, residents, and visitors regarding the theory and practice of DBS
- Demonstrates Clinical and Service excellence behaviors to include HCA code of conduct core fundamentals in daily interaction with patient, families, co-workers and physicians

Setting(s):

Surgical services areas including but not limited to hospitals and outpatient surgery centers.

Supervision:

- Direct supervision by ordering physician, performing only those functions specifically requested

The DBS Neurophysiologist will demonstrate:

- Provides a safe environment for patients
 - Uses at least two ways to identify patients before providing treatment or service
 - Participates in the pre-procedure process to verify the correct procedure, for the correct patient, at the correct site and involves the patient in the verification process when possible
 - o Participates in a time-out immediately before the start of an invasive procedure or making of the incision
- Safe and effective operation of electroneurodiagnostic equipment
 - Consistently obtains quality diagnostic outputs
 - o Maintains equipment to ensure accurate testing and diagnosis
 - o Operates digital computerized electroencephalography (EEG) instruments
 - o Demonstrates effective infection control practices related to equipment operation
- Accurate patient information review
 - Verifies that the requested procedure correlates with the patient's clinical history, presentation and physician order
 - Accesses the patient medical record appropriately
 - o Makes notes on the recorded graph to identify interferences
 - Documents in the medical record according to the facility standard / policy

 - o Performs the electroneurodiagnostic study to comply with applicable protocols and guidelines
 - Provides a written or oral summary of preliminary findings to the physician
