<p><b>Birth Doula:</b> The birth doula provides non-clinical emotional, physical, and evidence-based informational support to the birthing person before, during, and after birth.</p> <p><b>Definition of Care or Service:</b> The Birth Doula provides non-clinical emotional, physical, and evidence-based informational support to the birthing woman and her family before, during, and after birth. Scope of Service may include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Providing emotional and physical support, comfort measures, and informational resources, as well as support or suggestions for the partner.</li> <li>• Provides prenatal and postpartum support, including explanation and discussion of pregnancy options, birth practices, procedures, and assistance in acquiring the knowledge desired to make informed decisions about perinatal care.</li> <li>• Working closely with the birthing person and their family as they explore their values and needs surrounding birth.</li> <li>• Assist in the preparation of birth preferences to facilitate communication with the birth team</li> <li>• Provide evidence-based information on birth options and resources</li> <li>• Provide the birthing person with non-medical comfort techniques and alternatives for labor, including but not limited to positions and movement, comforting touch, visualization, breathing techniques, rebozo techniques, and affirmations with the approval of the attending obstetrician and nurse team.</li> <li>• Provide support and assist with initial newborn feeding</li> <li>• Refer to healthcare professionals when support requires clinical assessment, a need for prescription, or medical diagnosis</li> <li>• Demonstrates Clinical and Service excellence behaviors to include code of HCA Healthcare conduct core fundamentals in daily interactions with patients, families, co-workers and physicians.</li> </ul> <p><b>Limits to Services:</b> Doula's provide emotional, physical and information support only. The doula is not a clinician and therefore <b>does not</b>:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Diagnose medical conditions</li> <li>• Perform clinical procedures</li> <li>• Interpret medical diagnoses or clinical results</li> <li>• Prescribe or administer treatment of medical conditions</li> <li>• Perform clinical procedures</li> <li>• Make decisions for the birthing woman</li> <li>• Attend births that are intentionally unassisted by qualified medical professionals.</li> <li>• Have access to the patient's medical record</li> </ul> <p><b>Setting(s):</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Hospital Labor &amp; Delivery, Mother/Baby, and/or Neonatal Intensive Care Units, including patient rooms</li> </ul>

- Indirect supervision by Labor & Delivery staff, Director and Obstetric Providers.
